A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-06-19 of the North Dakota Century Code relating to required school counselors.

Relating to adoption of the counseling compact; and to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 43-47-06 of the North Dakota Century Code relating to licensure of counselors.



Relating to incorporating additional and different requirements for the North Dakota scholarship.

All Students Must Complete – Essential Skills

- Completed an individual consultative process or nine-week course
- Completed the civics test
- Completed a four-year rolling plan
- Obtained a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0; or and equivalent course proficiency score

- Completed four from the following:
 - 25 hours community service
 - 95% attendance rate
 - Career exploration experience
 - 2 years in cocurricular activities
 - 2 years in extracurricular activities
 - Capstone project
 - Online learning course
 - Successful demonstration of 21st
 Century Skills

Completed Requirements in Two of the Following Subdivisions:

- 24 ACT score or 1180 SAT; AND
- Two of the following:
 - At least a C in AP course
 - At least a C in dual credit course (math or English)
 - At least a C in algebra II
 - At least a C in 3 fine arts courses
 - At least a 3 on AP exam
 - At least a 4 on IBC exam
 - At least a 3.0 GPA

- 24 ACT, 1180 SAT or 5s on the 3 WorkKeys;
 AND
- 4 CTE units, including 2 from a coordinated plan of study; OR
- 3 units in the same world language, etc.;
 AND
- Two of the following:
 - Career Ready Practices course
 - At least a C in dual credit course
 - Technical assessment or industry credential
 - 40 hours workplace learning experience
 - 40 hours WBL experience
 - At least a 3 on NDSA (reading & math); or ACT sub-scores of 19 in English and 22 in math

- 50 ASVAB; <u>OR</u> 31 + completed basic training: <u>AND</u>
- At least a C in PE; AND
- Completed:
 - Any two indicators in the previous two columns;
 - 2 units of JROTC; or
 - Phase one of the cadet civil air patrol program

HB 1398 Passed – Signed by Governor

Relating to computer science and cybersecurity instruction for adult learners; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-01, 15.1-21-02, and 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to mandatory computer science and cybersecurity instruction and minimum requirements for high school graduation; and to provide an expiration date

Graduation Requirements:

Effective for 2023 Graduates

- 4 units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature, composition, and speech;
- 3 units of mathematics, which may include one unit of computer science approved by the superintendent of public instruction;
- 3 units of science, consisting of:
 - 1 unit of biology; and
 - 1 unit of chemistry; and
 - 1 unit of physics;

OR

- 1 unit biology; and
- 1 unit of physical science; and
- 1 unit (or 2 half-units) of any other science;

- 3 units of social studies, including:
 - 1 unit of US history;
 - ½ unit of US government and ½ unit of economics; OR
 - 1 unit of problems of democracy; AND
 - 1 unit (or 2 half-units) of any other social studies, which may include civics, civilization, geography and history, multicultural studies, ND studies, psychology, sociology, and world history;
- 1 unit of physical education; OR

- 3 units of social studies, including:
 - 1 unit of US history;

 - 1 unit of biology; and
 - 1 unit of chemistry; and
 - 1 unit of physics;

OR

- 1 unit biology; and
- 1 unit of physical science; and
- 1 unit (or 2 half-units) of any other science, which may include one unit of computer science or cybersecurity approved by the superintendent of public instruction (subdivision c)

- 3 units of social studies, including:
 - 1 unit of US history;
 - ½ unit of US government and ½ unit of economics; OR
 - 1 unit of problems of democracy; AND
 - 1 unit (or 2 half-units) of any other social studies, which may include civics, civilization, geography and history, multicultural studies, ND studies, psychology, sociology, and world history;

- ½ unit of physical education and ½ unit of health
- 3 units of:
 - Foreign languages;
 - Native American languages;

- One unit of computer science or cybersecurity whether under subdivision b, c, or both. (subdivision h)
- The requirements of subdivision h of subsection 1 are waived if the student has completed a computer science and cybersecurity integration plan approved by the school board.
