  - Gamified experiential learning simulation
  - Students work for businesses, manage money, and make decisions
  - Strong connection to financial literacy, teamwork, and employability skills
- [\*\*JA Career Expo\*\*](#)
  - Support for active career fairs and expos to enhance learning experience
  - Exposure to regional industries and career pathways
  - Flexible format for schools and districts
- [\*\*JA Job Shadow\*\*](#)
  - High impact, real-world career exploration experiences
  - Connects classroom learning to the workplace
  - Supports career awareness and professional skills
  - Can be combined with current district activities or VR experiences
- [\*\*JA Financial Literacy\*\*](#)
  - Meets all standards of new ½ credit financial literacy requirement
  - Topics include budgeting, saving, credit, and decision-making
  - Grade-appropriate and classroom-ready
- [\*\*JA Finance Park \(Entry Level\) & JA Finance Park Advanced\*\*](#)
  - Entry Level – grades 7-9 & Advanced – grades 10-12
  - Capstone simulation for financial literacy and career readiness
  - Students explore careers, income levels, and postsecondary pathways
  - Hands-on budgeting experience tied to real-life choices (housing, transportation, childcare, savings, etc.)
  - Reinforces employability skills: decision-making, critical thinking, and problem-solving
