General Qualifications for Academic or CTE Scholarship

- Qualifications for the scholarship are based on:
 - High school grade point average (3.0)
 - No grades lower than a C
 - Composite ACT Score (24) or WorkKeys Score (5)
 - Courses taken in high school
 - Residency



Basic Course Requirements- Academic and CTE Scholarships

• Students must meet all course requirements for high school graduation

- Students must also successfully complete some courses above and beyond those required for graduation
 - CTE Scholarship- heavier focus on Career and Technical Education Classes
 - Academic Scholarship- heavier focus on college level course work
 - Total of 22 credits

Summary of Courses Required for Scholarship Beyond Graduation Requirements

Academic Scholarship

- 1 credit Algebra II
- 1 credit of math for which Algebra II is a prerequisite
- One of the following:
 - ½ credit dual credit class
 - 1 full credit AP class AND the AP exam
- One of the following
 - 2 credits of same foreign language
 - 2 credits CTE in the same CTE coordinated Plan of Study

CTE Scholarship

- 1 credit Algebra II
- 4 credits of CTE
 - 2 of those credits in the same CTE Coordinated Plan of Study

2021 Legislative Bills that Impact the Scholarship

- HB 1083- relating to C or better requirement for Spring 2020 classes
- HB 1135- relating to proficiency-based grading and the scholarship
- SB 2136- relating to math requirement, teacher pathway, and trade schools
- SB 2141- relating to the SAT test being allowed for the scholarship
- SB 2289- aligns scholarship requirements to Choice Ready
 - Three-year overlap: Classes of 2022-2024 may use either the old or new requirements

House Bill 1083

- Removes the C or better requirement for the scholarship for courses taken <u>second</u> <u>semester of 2019-2020</u> school year
 - Due to quick adjustment to distance learning at beginning of the COVID-19 Pandemic
 - ONLY applies to second semester 2019-2020!!
- Signed by Governor Burgum March 25
- WILL NOT be reflected in eTranscript

House Bill 1135

• Allows a proficiency-based grading scale as part of an innovative education program approved by DPI to count for the scholarship

Signed by Governor Burgum April 19

Senate Bill 2136

- Revises some scholarship requirements
 - Allows Integrated Math II (11052) or Integrated Math III (11053) to replace Algebra II for CTE Scholarship
 - General Education Teacher Pathway from 3 credits to 2 credits
- Allows the scholarship to be used at professional career schools
- Signed by Governor Burgum March 22

Senate Bill 2141

• Allows an SAT score of <u>1180</u> or higher to be used in lieu of the ACT testing requirement for either the Academic or CTE Scholarship

• Does several things related to assessment unrelated to the scholarship (explained next slide)

Signed by Governor Burgum on March 29

Senate Bill 2141 (Cont.)

- Does several things related to assessment
 - Removes the requirement that all juniors must take the ACT or WorkKeys
 - State will no longer pay for juniors ACT or WorkKeys (unless for accountability)
 - Removes language regarding interim assessments
 - Calls for NDDPI to conduct a study on interim assessments during the 2021-2022 interim, and report to any findings and/or potential legislation for the 2023 legislative session

Senate Bill 2289

- Aligns scholarship requirements to the Choice Ready requirements
 - Similar to the choice ready requirements, but with rigor similar to the current scholarship requirements
- New Scholarship will be called the North Dakota Scholarship

Signed by Governor Burgum on April 19

SB 2289 (Cont.)

- Timeline:
 - <u>Classes of 2022, 2023, and 2024</u>: students may use **EITHER** the current or new requirements
 - Class of 2025: students will only be able to use the new requirements

Summary of the North Dakota Scholarship

As called for by SB 2289

General Summary

• Requirements are aligned to Choice Ready, but are <u>above and beyond</u> the requirements of Choice Ready

• A chart similar to the Choice Ready Chart will be developed later this summer, as well as guidance

Purpose of the North Dakota Scholarship

- The purpose is to align our scholarship with our strategic vision of students graduating Choice Ready
 - Every student that gets the scholarship would be Choice Ready, but not every student that is Choice Ready would get the scholarship
 - We want the answer to be more than just "I need this to qualify for the scholarship"

ND Scholarship Beginning Requirements

- Individual Consultation/9-week Career Course
- Civics Exam
- Four-Year Rolling Plan
- 3.0 cumulative GPA
- Essential Skills (4 of the 8)

North Dakota Scholarship Components

- Students must meet two of the three components
 - Post-Secondary Ready
 - Workforce Ready
 - Military Ready
- These will be more rigorous than the corresponding components for Choice Ready

Essential Skills (4 of the 8)

- 25 hours of community service
- 95% attendance (excluding school activities)
- Career exploration experience
- 2 years organized co-curricular activity
- 2 years extra-curricular activity
- Capstone project
- Online learning course
- Demonstrate competency in 21st Century Skills (4 C's)

Post-Secondary Ready

- ACT score of 24 or above (or 1180 on SAT)
- Two of the following:
 - Grade of C or higher in an AP course
 - Grade of C or higher in a dual credit English or math course
 - Grade of C or higher for one credit of Algebra II
 - Score of 3 or higher on an AP exam
 - Score of 4 or higher on an International Baccalaureate (IB) exam
 - GPA of 3.0 or higher alongst courses required for NDUS admission

Workforce Ready

• 4 credits of CTE, with 2 credits in the same Coordinated Plan of Study

- Meeting one of the following testing requirements:
 - ACT score of 24 or higher
 - WorkKeys scores of 5 or higher (for all three WorkKeys tests- Applied Math, Graphic Literacy, Workplace Documents)

Workforce Ready (Cont.)

- Two of the following:
 - Career ready practices
 - Grade of C or higher in a dual credit course
 - Technical assessment or industry credential
 - 40-hour workplace learning experience
 - 40-hour work-based learning experience
 - One of the following
 - NDSA score of 3 or higher in both reading and math
 - ACT score of 19 in English and ACT score of 22 in math (if ACT used for accountability)

Military Ready

- Score of 85 or higher on ASVAB
 - Unless completed basic training, and if so, an ASVAB score of 31 will suffice
- Grade of C or higher in a physical education course
- Complete one of the following
 - Two indicators from the 6 additional indicators under Postsecondary Ready
 - Two indicators from the 6 additional indicators under Workforce Ready

Summary of Requirements Above and Beyond Choice Ready

- 3.0 Overall GPA
- 24 on the ACT for Post-Secondary Ready Option
- 24 on ACT or 5 or higher on WorkKeys for Workforce-Ready Option
- 4 credits CTE, 2 in same plan of study for Workforce-Ready Option
- ASVAB score of 85 for Military-Ready Option
- CREAM/CLEM Classes cannot be used for Post-Secondary Ready or Military Ready

Current Academic Scholarship Requirements Not Included in the New Requirements?

- No Algebra II requirement (but is an option)
- No math course for which Algebra II is a prerequisite required
- No foreign language requirement
- No dual credit/AP requirement (but is an option)

Timeline for Implementation

• <u>Classes of 2022, 2023, and 2024</u>: students may use **EITHER** the current or new requirements

• Class of 2025: students will only be able to use the new requirements

eTranscript and Scholarship Application

• We are currently working with North Dakota ITD to dertmine the best path going forward for eTranscript, the scholarship application, etc. with the new scholarship requirements

ACT Superscores

- ACT is now issuing Superscores!
 - A superscore combines a student's best English, math, reading, and science scores into one score for students that have taken the ACT more than once
- Starting with the graduating class of 2021, students may use an ACT superscore to meet the requirement of earning a 24 or higher
- The superscore <u>must come from ACT!</u>
 - Can't be a hand calculation of the regular ACT scores
 - Student has to select that they wish to have a superscore at the time they apply to take the test
