Provide management to the state's seven CTSOs.





CTE Programs

Ensure quality by providing leadership, technical assistance, funding, and accountability for all CTE program areas.



Career Readiness

Develop and train on career exploration and readiness tools, such as RUReady.ND.gov, Workbased Learning (WBL), and Career Ready Practices.



Initiatives

Manage programs, as directed by the Legislature, such as TrainND, Marketplace for Kids, and CTE Capital Projects Grant.



CTSOs

Lead the state's seven Career and Technical Student Organizations.

HOW WE MEASURE SUCCESS

Measure of Success

Increase the percentage of CTE Concentrators from 28.5% in 2023 to 40% in 2028.

Measure of Success

Increase the percentage of students that graduate workforce ready from 88% in 2023 to 94% in 2028.

Measure of Success

Increase the percentage of rural students that enroll in a CTE program at a Career and Technology Center.

Measure of Success

Continue to develop programming to recruit, retain and develop succession planning for high quality secondary and post-secondary CTE teachers, counselors, and administrators.

Measure of Success

Increase CTE postsecondary and incumbent workforce training enrollment.
