Marketing Education & DECA Updates

Marketing Education and DECA continue to grow in the state of North Dakota. Four new marketing education programs and DECA Chapters were started this year. The 71st North Dakota DECA Conference was held March 3-5 in Bismarck at the Radisson Hotel and the Belle Mehus Auditorium in downtown Bismarck. The DECA membership in North Dakota reached almost 1,100 members with the highest ever DECA membership, which includes the most DECA chapters in the state.



This evolved into the largest ever Fall Leadership Conference held in October in Fargo and the largest ever state conference held in Bismarck in March.

Conference highlights included the OM Hager Award of Excellence presented to Greg Borders from West Fargo, the New Advisor of the Year presented to Amber Johnson from SRCTC, the election of the 2025 officer team, and awarding the finalists and top winners in 51 competitive events. Kevin Reisenauer was honored for his 43 years of service to North Dakota DECA and 28th year as state advisor. Advisors and students, and the Army National Guard recognized him for his dedication, growth, and commitment for the past 43 years.

Students competed in 51 competitive events held on-site in March. Students also competed in virtual competition during the school year including the Thrive Campaign, the Advocacy Campaign, Virtual Business Challenge, the Stock Market Game, and Stukent competition. More than \$6,000 in scholarships were awarded at the state conference. Beth Schmaltz, Rugby was

named Outstanding New Member for the state and she will represent North Dakota at the International Conference next month.

Over 200 members and advisors will represent North Dakota at the International Conference in Anaheim, California in April.

ACTE National Leadership Fellowship Program

It's time for you to become a leader in CTE by applying to be in the ACTE National Leaders Fellowship Program. The Fellowship program is a one-year commitment from January 2025 through December 2025. During the program year, fellows will discuss the importance of CTE programing and serve on a CTE task force to address issues at the state, region, and national levels.

The ACTE National Leadership Fellowship Program began in 2009 as an Opportunity Fund project initiated by the ACTE Board of Directors. The purpose of the ACTE Fellowship Program is to:

- 1. help establish a leadership development program for CTE educators in ACTE and assist individuals in further developing their leadership skills in CTE and their involvement in professional associations
- 2. provide an opportunity for CTE educators to become familiar with and participate in the processes used by policymakers in the development and implementation of laws, regulations and other public policies at the local, state and federal levels
- 3. identify, train and motivate a cadre of leaders who will continue to position ACTE as a leader in developing an educated, prepared, adaptable and competitive workforce

In summary, the ACTE Fellowship Program is an instrument to provide **professional development**, **policy knowledge** and **leadership development**.

State Board for CTE Approved Student Outcome Goals

As I reported back in August 2024, the State Board for Career and Technical Education is currently participating in the North Dakota Be Legendary Board Training. Some of you may be familiar with this as your local school board may have or are currently going through the same training. The journey continues for the State CTE Board, and it has been a very interesting one; not only for the Board and the Department, but also for our trainers. This is because we are a State Board and not a local school board, hence



adjustments need to be made. Yet, we are not losing sight that adult behaviors need to change if we expect student outcomes to change.

I am happy to report that we continue to make great progress on developing the future of CTE in North Dakota to student outcomes in mind. Although we don't have the direct impact all of you have, NDCTE's role is to ensure you all have the resources necessary to influence student outcomes.

To keep you all up to date, I would like to report the Board approved Student Outcome Goals.

- The percentage of students identified as concentrators in Career and Technical Education as measured by the Consolidated Annual Report will increase from 28.5% in January 2024 to 40% in January 2028.
- The percentage of students who graduate Workforce Ready will increase from 88% in the 2022-23 school year to 93% in the 2027-28 school year as measured by the North Dakota Choice Ready Report.
- The percentage of rural students that enroll in a program at a CTE Center will increase from 36% in 2022-23 to 41% in 2027-2028 as measured by the CTE Center Membership Report.

Although there is much work yet to be done, the State Board and I are excited and motivated to continue to move forward with a new focus. I will continue to update you all as we progress through this journey.
