An Update on the Workforce Development Council

In May, I wrote about how the Workforce Development Council has focused on Career Exploration and Skills Gap as one of its strategic themes. Through out the spring and summer of 2022, the Workforce Development Council has discussed and finetuned the recommendations that will be submitted to the Governor's Office and the 2023 Legislative Assembly. As I mentioned in May, Career and Technical Education is a focus of the Workforce Development Council



and their recommendations support the work all of you are doing.

The recommendations, specific to CTE, are as follows:

- ⇒ Provide appropriate funding for the operations and programming of new and expanding Area Career and Technology Centers.
- ⇒ Provide funding to support a minimum of sixteen work-based learning coordinators to serve students attending CTE coursework at Area Career and Technology Centers.
- \Rightarrow In order to support career awareness and exploration, provide funding to school districts in order to secure access to a dedicated Career Advisor.
- ⇒ Create a full-time Apprenticeship Coordinator, to be housed at the North Dakota Department of Commerce, to assist employers in navigating the process of developing apprenticeship opportunities.

As mentioned, these are simply recommendations, so they will need to go through the budgeting and Legislative Process. It is worth noting, that it is clear that Career and Technical Education has the full support of the Workforce Development Council and its individual members.

Automotive Teachers Rejoice

From talking with instructors that teach in the automotive cluster and industry partners in the automotive field, I've heard one thing loud and clear, HOW DO I FIND TIME TO RENEW MY ASE CERTIFICATONS? With ASE testing centers few and far between in North Dakota, finding the time and location can be difficult for teachers and technicians. ASE listened to those concerns and I'm happy to pass along to you another option for certification renewal.

ASE has launched the ASE Renewal App for anyone needing to extend the expiration date of their Automobile Series A1-A9 Certifications. The renewal app allows you to keep your A series certifications current and up to date without visiting a testing center.

So, how does it work?

The ASE Renewal App is subscription based. You will receive one question per area every 30 days delivered straight to the app. After earning 8 credits in one certification area during the subscription period, you will receive a 1-year extension to that certification. If you answer every question correctly on the first try, you could earn 8 credits in about 8 months. Get a question wrong? If you get a question wrong, you will be given a 2nd chance question 10 days later and it will be in addition to your regularly scheduled questions. The 2nd chance questions give you an opportunity to verify that you have learned more about this topic, as well as another opportunity to earn credit toward meeting your certification extension goal. If you miss the 2nd chance question, you will get a 3rd chance after another 10 days. So, you will have multiple chances to earn the required 8 credits. If you accumulate 8 credits for the certification area by the end of your subscription year, your certification will be extended 1 year.
