College Board/AP Program to Launch AP Career Kickstart

The AP Program is getting ready to launch new courses! AP Career Kickstart expands the AP Program by offering high schools a new set of career courses and exams. AP Career Kickstart is partnering with employers, college faculty, and high school educators to design courses that can lead to college credit **and** employer-endorsed



credentials and prepare students for high-demand jobs. (https://apcentral.collegeboard.org/courses/ap-career-kickstart)

Two new courses will be launched for the 2026-2027 school year: AP Business with Personal Finance and AP Cybersecurity, followed by a third course in the 2027-2028 school year: AP Networking. These courses will teach professional skills and can be offered as a part of state's Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathways.

I recently attended the AP Program Annual Conference in Boston to learn more about AP Career Kickstart...and specifically the AP Business with Personal Finance course. AP Business with Personal Finance is recommended for 9th and 10th graders – or students in their first or second year of a career pathway. AP Business with Personal Finance has 85 teachers and CTSO advisors that will be field testing content during the 2025-2026 school year before the course is available in 2026-2027. AP Cybersecurity is being piloted during the 2025-2026 school year and will be available in 2026-2027, and AP Networking will be available in 2027-2028. Teachers new to each course will be able to apply for grants to cover the cost of attending AP Summer Institute for training.

North Dakota CTE and North Dakota DPI are scheduled to meet with College Board/ AP staff later in August to discuss how these courses could be incorporated into options for North Dakota students. 
How To Use Compass To Find Sponsorships and Careers

<u>Compass</u> and <u>RUReady.ND.gov</u> make it easy for students to explore careers – ones that interest them already and those they haven't even heard of yet!

Your students can find Career



Profiles under the section "Opportunities" in Compass. These detailed descriptions of real jobs at regional employers provide valuable information about the employer, work culture, job responsibilities, day-in-the -life, salary and benefits, required education, and related high school classes and activities. Career Profiles also highlight the Holland Codes and personality types that are currently working in that role, all designed to help students discover if they would be a good match.

Students can also find Sponsorships in Compass. These are student-employer agreements that include partial or full tuition coverage in exchange for a signed work agreement. In other words, an employer agrees to pay for a student's postsecondary schooling if they promise to work for them when they graduate. Some even offer paid work experience while you are in school. When viewing Career Profiles in Compass, students can use filters to search for those that include Sponsorships.

Encourage your students to log into Compass and start exploring Career Profiles today!

Do you have a creative way to enhance Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects in the classroom? Whether it's a unique lesson, an engaging activity, or a strategy to help students successfully implement their SAEs, we want to hear about it!

About the Contest

The SAE Innovation Challenge encourages North Dakota agricultural educators and FFA advisors to share effective teaching methods and SAE implementation strategies. This is your chance to contribute to a growing collection of best practices while gaining recognition for your innovative approach.

Submission Guidelines

What to Submit:

A lesson, activity, or strategy that enhances SAE learning and implementation. Your submission can focus on any aspect of SAEs, such as:

- Helping students select and develop their SAE projects.
- Managing records and documentation.
- Connecting SAEs to real-world career skills.
- Creative ways to engage students in their projects.

Narrative Guidelines:

Your submission must include a narrative that follows the outline below. The narrative must be limited to one single-sided, single-spaced $8\ 1/2" \times 11"$ page. It must be typewritten, uploaded through the online application form, and written in Times New Roman, 12-point font.

The narrative must be organized into the following sections:

Overview:

- Provide a brief description of your idea and explain how it is unique, fresh, or novel within the context of agricultural education, particularly with regard to SAE projects.

• Practicality of Idea:

- Discuss how your idea has practical appeal for agricultural education teachers and how it could be applied widely to enhance SAE projects in different classrooms.

• Adaptability of Instruction:

- Explain how your idea is useful and feasible for other agricultural educators to implement in their own SAE programs, no matter the specific subject area or grade level.

Supporting Document Guidelines:

In addition to your narrative, you must submit supporting materials to help tell the story of your submission. These materials should enhance and clarify your idea and may include:

- A collage of photos showing the implementation of your idea in the classroom or with students.
- A worksheet, rubric, or template that was used as part of your SAE project.
- Any other visual or written document that supports the impact and practicality of your submission.

The supporting document should clearly complement the narrative to help showcase your idea.

Who Can Participate?

Open to all North Dakota Agricultural Educators and FFA Advisors in state-approved programs. Each teacher may submit only one entry.

Why Enter?

- Share your knowledge and inspire fellow ag teachers.
- Gain recognition for your innovative SAE approach.
- Have your idea featured in a shared resource for educators.

Judging & Recognition

- Entries will be reviewed based on creativity, effectiveness, and practicality by a panel of judges outside of North Dakota to ensure fairness.
- Submissions will be blindly reviewed (teacher names will be redacted).
- Winning entries may be showcased in a resource collection, newsletter, or future training sessions.

Prize Breakdown (\$2,000 Total!)

1st Place: \$500

• 2nd Place: \$300

• 3rd Place: \$200

- People's Choice Awards (2 winners, voted by ag teachers): \$100 each
- Random Drawing Prize (All entrants eligible): \$300
- Most Entries from a District: \$500*

(*Must have a minimum of three submissions from the district. Participating teachers in that district will be entered into a district-exclusive random drawing.)
