During the 2023 FBLA Conference, 282 high school students sat for the Ethics Exam and 265 passed the exam. Another 43 middle school students sat for the exam, and 41 of those passed.

Update on National Career Clusters Framework

As you know The National Career Clusters® Framework is undergoing a modernization effort led by Advance CTE, WestEd, and Indigo Education Company to ensure it remains responsive and relevant to both the world of work and learner needs. As part of this process, a survey was launched in October to collect information on how The



National Career Clusters® Framework are being used. Hopefully many of you completed the survey. Feedback is also being gathered through a series of national Industry Advisory Groups meetings.

Feedback will continue to be gathered in 2024. The Industry Advisory Groups will continue to meet in January 2024. During the first half of 2024, a series of validation activities, including a national validation survey, will be launched. The intent of national validation survey is to gather feedback from the education field. It is imperative for all of you to engage in the feedback survey, to ensure the Framework accurately represents the needs of business and industry and the instruction provided by Career and Technical Education in North Dakota.

A final version of the revised framework will be brought to the Advance CTE Board in August 2024, with a final report, crosswalk, and implementation guide to follow.

We will do our best to continue to keep you all apprised of all updates as they come available.

The mission of the State Board for Career and Technical Education is to work with others to provide all North Dakota citizens with the technical skills, knowledge, and attitudes necessary for successful performance in a globally competitive workplace.

Assistant Director's Corner

Perkins CLNA

Perkins V refers to the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act, which is the federal law that governs career and technical education (CTE) programs in the United States. CLNA stands for Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment, and it is a key requirement under Perkins V.

The Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment is a process that each eligible recipient of Perkins V funds must undergo every two years to identify the strengths and weaknesses of their CTE programs. This assessment helps education agencies, institutions, and other stakeholders understand the local context and make informed decisions to improve the quality of CTE programs.

The CLNA involves a thorough review of various factors, including labor market needs, student performance data, program quality, and alignment with state and local workforce development priorities. The goal is to ensure that CTE programs are responsive to the needs of both students and the local job market.

Through the CLNA process, education agencies can identify areas for improvement, set priorities, and develop strategies to enhance the effectiveness of their CTE programs. This aligns with the broader objectives of Perkins V, which aims to strengthen the connections between education and the workforce to better prepare students for successful careers.

For those that have done a CLNA in the past, hopefully you will see improvements to it. We have streamlined it as much as the Federal government will allow to eliminate duplicate entries and redundancy. The CLNA is due March 1st and needs to be approved before the completion of the Local Application, which has a due date of April 30th.
