Building a Career-Ready Culture in Your School

Empowering Students to Think Beyond Graduation

Preparing students for life after high school isn't just the job of one counselor or CTE teacher, it's a schoolwide effort. Building a career-ready culture means every educator plays a role in helping students develop the skills, mindsets, and awareness they'll need to thrive in the workforce and post-secondary life.

What Is a Career-Ready Culture?

A career-ready culture is one where students:

- See clear connections between school and the real world
- Build employability skills in all subject areas
- Have regular exposure to career exploration opportunities
- Are supported in setting goals and making informed plans

It's also a school where **teachers**, **administrators**, **and community partners** share the responsibility of preparing students for the future—not just college, but careers.

5 Ways to Foster Career Readiness Schoolwide

1. Start With Staff Awareness

Hold a short PD session or staff meeting discussion around career-ready practices. Use frameworks like the <u>12</u> <u>Career Ready Practices</u> from Advance CTE. Everyone—math, English, PE, art—can contribute.

2. Integrate Career Conversations into the Classroom

Encourage all teachers to:

Invite guest speakers in their field

Link lessons to real-world careers ("When would an engineer use this equation?")

Discuss how the soft skills practiced in class (like teamwork, deadlines, problem solving) translate to work settings

3. Use Advisory Periods for Career Planning

Short, consistent lessons during homeroom or advisory can include career interest surveys, resume building, or digital portfolios.

4. Celebrate Career Pathways

Host **Career Spirit Weeks**, where each day spotlights a different cluster or trade. Display career posters in hallways, classrooms, and online. Celebrate students who get jobs, internships, or industry certifications.

5. Connect With the Community

Invite local businesses for **career fairs**, **classroom visits**, **or mock interviews**. These events broaden student awareness and build important community-school relationships.

NDSU hosts 3rd Annual Say Yes to FCS Day!



North Dakota CTE Program Quality Vision Visits: Advancing Excellence Through Support and Collaboration

The North Dakota Career and Technical Education (CTE) department is proud to announce the 2025–2026 schedule for our **Program Quality Team Vision Visits**. These visits are an essential part of our commitment to ensuring every CTE program in the state is not only meeting expectations but striving for excellence. Conducted at least once every five years, Vision Visits provide meaningful technical assistance to programs and educators with the goal of continuous improvement, innovation, and enhanced student outcomes.

What Are Program Quality Vision Visits?

Vision Visits are collaborative evaluations designed to strengthen North Dakota's CTE programs. Through direct engagement with educators, administrators, and staff, these visits promote best practices, address compliance, and identify opportunities for program enhancement.

Key goals of the Vision Visits include:

- Promoting Best Practices Sharing proven teaching strategies and effective program models.
- Ensuring Compliance Verifying that programs align with state and federal guidelines.
- Supporting Educators Providing actionable feedback, resources, and support.
- Improving Student Success Helping ensure students are career-ready with the skills they need to thrive.

What to Expect During a Vision Visit

Each visit includes:

- Self-Review and Standards Overview A collaborative discussion with the program instructor to review current practices and align with state standards.
- Exit Review (15 minutes) A wrap-up meeting with the instructor, school administration, and a program supervisor, which includes:
- **Commendations** Recognizing the program's strengths.
- **Recommendations** Offering guidance for improvement.
- Violations (if any) Outlining required actions to meet legal or policy standards.

Following the visit:

- A detailed report will be provided within 20 days.
- If any violations are noted, a Plan of Action must be submitted within 30 days.
- A follow-up visit will be scheduled to confirm corrective steps have been taken.
